
Restoring Vision, Celebrating Light










Serving Hope in Kariobangi


Medical Camp Success in Kirinyaga County

Why Lions for service?

Lions International is the world's largest service organisa-tion, having 1.4 million members in 210 countries of the world and 50,000 clubs. It has been in existence for 107 years, with their headquarters in Oakbrook, Chicago, USA. Their services cover the global causes of vision, diabetes, environment, childhood cancer, and hunger. The motto is we serve. Slogan is where there's

What are your goals for your year as district governor?

I have a desire of making my mark as I set goals of adding 20 new clubs in my district and add 600 new members by the end of my year in June 2025. In the past, we have struggled for over 10 years with stagnating membership. I started the year with 1,671 members and 61 clubs. I would like to get to 2000 members in the district comprising Kenya, Ethiopia, andSeychelles. I believe it can be done with a systematic approach of getting to the right people nationwide who would love to serve their brothers but not aware of this beau-tiful organisation that captures the needs of today's world.

Which country has the larg-est membership of lioness to-day?

Lions International has stagnated in the Western world, perhaps due to the busier life-style and ageing population. USA continues to be the largest country in terms of member-ship. However, the South Asian population, comprising of India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka, is today fastest-growing area in the

What are your notable projects that have benefitted the human beings in your district?

We have our Lions' sight first eve hospital in Loresho, Naiwhich is today rated as the best lion's eye hospital in Africa. They carry out thousands of eye operations and restore people's sight from all over the regions of Kenya. The hospital has the best doctors and surgeons with state-of-the-art equipment. For those who are unable to afford the price of the operations, we have major donors from within the local communities as well as those from the rest of the world who support us without any hes-itation. Lions clubs also emphasise education under the youth empowerment cause; the clubs own and operate primary and secondary schools in almost 14 regions of the country. The fund-ing support is done by various clubs from Europe and America and is done from numerous international support organisa-tions, such as the United Na-tions, Johnson & Johnson, the



Supporting Naromoru Children's Home








LC Kagio Central Monthly Eye Camp




