them start businesses, empowering them toward greater independence and sustainability.



It was a truly wonderful day of giving and celebration.






Lions Club of Ruiru Pioneer and PFC Support Karuri, Kiambaa Community

Lions Clubs Celebrate Christmas with **KNH Pediatric Cancer Ward**



Lions and Leos of Kisii County Visit Children's Home




On December 12, 2024, Lions and Leos of Kisii County donated essential items and conducted First Aid training at Kisii Children's Home.
